The heritage of Trevecca Nazarene College dates back to Wales in 1768 when six students were expelled from Oxford University for participating in religious practices. Lady Huntington, being a religious person, began to take definite steps toward a plan which she had been contemplating for some time. She established a college for the purpose of training young ministers.


Rev. J. O. McClurkan, greatly impressed with the need for trained ministers and with the leadership of God, formally opened the doors of Trevecca to students in 1901. Like Lady Huntington, the foundation of planning and prayer had been laid years before his dream became a reality.

Impressed by the emphasis of Lady Huntington's school, he chose the name Trevecca and opened the school with the objective of training missionaries and Christian workers. It was then a distinct Bible training school.

The College was engaged in various relocations during its establishing years: one of these being the move in 1913 to the Gallatin Road location. Growth necessitated the change. The campus was located on the Warner Estate with a colonial mansion as its main building.

In 1935, Dr. Hardy leased the property at the present site, and the school purchased it three years later through the negotiations of Dr. Mackey. From the beginning the school was known for its success in scattering the Gospel over the U.S. and to foreign lands.

Though there were problems, financial and otherwise, there remained a strong faith. The Lord was smiling upon our leaders, and they were looking forward to bigger and better things.






The cafeteria changes its name to Bud Robinson Hall.



The future of Trevecca is brighter than it has ever been in the past. According to a ten-year projection study, expansion is to reach a height unthought of heretofore.

The beginning of the proposed projection of campus building is scheduled for the fall of 1965, with two new dormitories ready for occupancy: one men's dormitory and the completion of the second floor of the cafeteria to be used temporarily as a women's dormitory. This building is the future Student Union building. By the fall of '66, two additional dormitories, one for men and one for women, will have been constructed. The multi-purpose building (combination auditorium, seating 1200 and complete with physical education facilities) is in the plans for '67, and the science building is the proposed addition for '68.

According to the projections of the Research in the area of curriculum expansion, by 1975, nine majors and three additional minors will be added. Additions of courses in the 10-year projection will be between 390 and 400 college hours, which is a 50% increase, requiring approximately 30 new faculty members. The enrollment is expected to reach 1400.

There has been a process of broadening the number of hours in courses in the direction of four-and-five-hour concentration. This will ultimately do away with most two-hour courses, and the gulf between semester hours and quarter hours will then be gapped.

At the termination of the 10 years, the library is expected to be equipped with 90,000 volumes, complete with an audio-visual department. An annual acquisition of 6,200 volumes is the goal.

Also, to meet the larger need and demand of the people on the zone, a plan for a nurses training program is being instituted in the near future, as well as the expansion of the Economics department into a department of Economics and Business Administration.

Dr. Greathouse's purpose is to build a strong academic school and, at the same time, keep the genius of Trevecca's spirituality.

GENERAL ASSEMBLY

The sixteenth General Assembly and conventions of the Church of the Nazarene convened in Portland, Oregon, in June, 1964.

The Assembly opened with a communion service with 21,000 present. This was the largest gathering in the history of the Church of the Nazarene and of the Portland Coliseum.

Included in the General Assembly and conventions were the following: Dr. George Coulter, former Executive Secretary of the Department of Foreign Missions, was elected General Supt. Dr. E. S. Phillips was elected Executive Secretary of the Department of World Missions, succeeding Dr. Coulter. Mrs. Gordon Olsen was elected President of the General N.F.M.S. Rev. John Hancock was elected N.Y.P.S. President. He is the first from the southeast zone to serve in this capacity. Re-elected was Mr. Paul Skiles, Secretary of the General N.Y.P.S.

Also, one of the major decisions of the General Assembly was the authorization of two new Nazarene colleges on the junior level.

The theme of the next quadrennium was proclaimed by the inspirational platform banners: "In The Power of the Spirit—Preach, Teach, Live, Win."




