




DEDICATION




THROUGH CULTURAL ENRICHMENT



TREVECCA'S FESTIVAL SCENES





JEREMIAH 15

2 And it shall come to pass, if they say unto thee, Whither shall we go forth? then thou shalt tell them, Thus saith the LORD: ^aSuch as are for death, to death; and such as are for the sword, to the sword; and such as are for the famine, to the famine; and such as are for the captivity, to the captivity.

3 And I will appoint over them four ^bkinds, saith the LORD: the sword to slay, and the dogs to tear, and ^cthe fowls of the heaven, and the beasts of the earth, to devour and destroy.

4 And ^dI will cause them to be removed into all kingdoms of the earth, because of ^eMa-nas, seh the son of Hez-e-ki-ah king of Judah, for that which he did in Jerusalem.

5 For who shall have pity upon thee, O Jerusalem? or who shall bemoan thee? or who shall go aside ^fto ask how thou doest?

6 ^gThou hast forsaken me, saith the LORD, thou art ^hgone backward: therefore will I stretch out my hand against thee, and destroy thee; ⁱI am weary with repenting.

7 And I will fan them with a fan in the gates of the land; I will bereave ^jthem of children, I will destroy ^kmy people, ^lsince they return not from their ways.

8 Their widows are increased to me above the sand of the seas; I have brought upon them ^magainst the mother of the young men a spoiler at noon-day; I have caused ⁿhim to fall upon it suddenly, and terrors upon the city.

9 ^oShe that hath borne seven languisheth: she hath given up the ghost; ^pher sun is gone down while it was yet day: she hath been ashamed and confounded; and the residue of them will I deliver to the sword before their enemies, saith the LORD.

10 ^qWoe is me, my mother, that thou hast borne me a man of strife and a man of contention to the whole earth! I have neither lent on usury, nor men

have lent to me on usury; yet every one of them doth curse me.

11 The LORD said, Verily it shall be well with thy remnant; verily ^rI will cause ^sthe enemy to entreat thee well in the time of evil and in the time of affliction.

12 Shall iron break the northern iron and the steel?

13 Thy substance and thy treasures will I give to the spoil without price, and that for all thy sins, even in all thy borders.

14 And I will make ^tthee to pass with thine enemies into a land which thou knowest not: for a fire is kindled in mine anger, which shall burn upon you.

15 ^uO LORD, ^vthou knowest: remember me, and visit me, and ^wrevenge me of my persecutors: take me not away in thy long-suffering: know that ^xfor thy sake I have suffered rebuke.

16 Thy words were found, and I did fear them: and ^ythy word was unto me the joy and rejoicing of mine heart: for ^zI am called by thy name, O LORD God of hosts.

17 ^{aa}I sat not in the assembly of the mockers, nor rejoiced; I sat alone because of thy hand: for thou hast filled me with indignation.

18 Why is my ^{ab}pain perpetual, and my wound incurable, which refuseth to be healed? will thou be altogether unto me ^{ac}as a liar and as waters that ^{ad}fail?

19 ^{ae}Therefore thus saith the LORD, ^{af}If thou return, then will I bring thee again, and thou shalt stand before me: and if thou ^{ag}take forth the precious from the vile, thou shalt be as my mouth: let them return unto thee; but return not thou unto them.

20 And I will make thee unto this people a fenced hrasen wall, and they shall fight against thee, but ^{ah}they shall not prevail against thee: for I am with thee

and to deliver thee, O LORD.

And I will deliver thee out of the hand of the wicked, and I will redeem thee out of the hand of the terrible.

CHAPTER 16

THE word of the LORD came also unto me, saying,

2 Thou shalt not take thee a wife, neither shalt thou have sons or daughters in this place.

3 For thus saith the LORD concerning the sons and concerning the daughters that are born in this place, and concerning their mothers that bare them, and concerning their fathers that begat them in this land;

4 They shall die of ^{ai}grievous deaths; they shall not be lamented; neither shall they be buried; but they shall be cast upon the face of the earth: and they shall be consumed by the sword, and by famine; and their carcasses shall be meat for the fowls of heaven, and for the beasts of the earth.

5 For thus saith the LORD, Enter not into the house of mourning, neither go to lament nor bemoan them: for I have taken away my peace from this people, saith the LORD, even bringing kindness and mercies.

6 Both the great and the small shall die in this land: they shall not be buried, ^{aj}neither shall men lament for them, nor ^{ak}call themselves, nor ^{al}make themselves bald for them:

7 Neither shall men ^{am}tear themselves for them in mourning, to comfort them for the dead; neither shall men give them the cup of consolation to ^{an}drink for their father or for their mother.

8 Thou shalt not also go into the house of feasting, to sit with them to eat and to drink.

9 For thus saith the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel; Behold, ^{ao}I will cause to cease out of this place in your eyes, and in your days, the voice of mirth, and the voice of gladness, the voice of

the bridegroom, and the voice of the bride.

10 ^{ap}And it shall come to pass, when thou shalt shew this people all these words, and they shall say unto thee, ^{aq}Wherefore hath the LORD pronounced all this great evil against us? or what is our iniquity? or what is our sin that we have committed against the LORD our God?

11 Then shalt thou say unto them, ^{ar}Because your fathers have forsaken me, saith the LORD, and have walked after other gods, and have served them, and have worshipped them, and have forsaken me, and have not kept my law;

12 And ye have done ^{as}worse than your fathers; for, behold, ^{at}ye walk every one after the ^{au}imagination of his evil heart, that they may not hearken unto me:

13 ^{av}Therefore will I cast you out of this land ^{aw}into a land that ye know not, ^{ax}neither ye nor your fathers; and there shall ye serve other gods day and night; where I will not shew you favour.

14 ^{ay}Therefore, behold, the ^{az}days come, saith the LORD, that it shall no more be said, The LORD liveth, that brought up the children of Israel out of the land of Egypt;

15 But, The LORD liveth, that brought up the children of Israel from the land of the north, and from all the lands whither he had driven them: and ^{ba}it will bring them again into their land that I gave unto their fathers.

16 ^{bb}Behold, I will send for many ^{bc}fishers, saith the LORD, and they shall fish them; and after will I send for many hunters, and they shall hunt them from every mountain, and from every hill, and out of the holes of the rocks.

17 For mine ^{bd}eyes are upon all their ways: they are not hid from my face, neither is their iniquity hid from mine eyes.

18 And first I will recompense

DR. HOWARD HAMLIN: GOD'S MAN










